Description:

Create a vibrant sunset mountain scene where the sky bursts with fiery reds, glowing yellows, and soft purples above a stained-glass style mountain. This step-by-step project is easy, colourful, and leaves you with artwork that looks bold and stunning.

Materials Needed:

- Acrylic paint in red, orange, yellow, dark blue, medium blue, light blue, turquoise, purple, white, and black
- Medium round brush and liner brush
- Pencil

- Black permanent marker
- Paper towel
- Water
- Paint Palette

F-010 Stained Glass Mountain Sunrise Art Project Instructions:

1. Prepare Your Paper and Supplies

- a. Place your Art Cards by Kids Art Sheet on the table horizontally. Make sure the horizontal arrows on the left side are pointing upwards.
- b. Gather the necessary supplies for your artwork.

2. Write Your Name

a. At the top, write your name, teacher's name, age, and grade in big, bold letters using a marker or pen—no pencil!

3. Sketch the Scene

- a. With your pencil, sketch the sky, the sun, and the outline of a mountain. Divide the page into large wavy blocks going across the sky and mountain, like pieces of a stained-glass window.
- b. There should be 19 blocks in the sky including the sun, and 22 blocks on the mountain. Each block will be painted with a single colour.

4. Paint the Sun

a. Mix orange and red to create a fiery colour. Paint the sun with that colour using a round brush.

5. Red Sky Blocks

a. Pick three or more blocks in the sky and paint them red with the round brush.

6. Yellow Sky Blocks

a. Pick three or more blocks in the sky and paint them yellow with the round brush.

7. Orange Sky Blocks

a. Pick three or more blocks in the sky and paint them orange with the round brush.

8. Pink Sky Blocks

a. Mix red, white, and a bit of orange to make a pink colour. Pick three or more blocks in the sky and paint them with that pink colour with the round brush.

9. Purple Sky Blocks

a. Mix pink and purple to make a soft lavender colour. Pick three or more blocks in the sky and paint them with that purple colour with the round brush.

10. Deep Yellow Sky Block

a. Mix orange and yellow to get a deep yellow colour. Pick one or more blocks in the sky and paint them with that deep yellow colour with the round brush.

11. Deep Pink Sky Block

a. Mix pink paint with more red to get a deeper pink colour. Paint the last block or blocks with that deep pink colour with the round brush.

12. Dark Blue Mountain Blocks

a. Pick five or more blocks on the mountain and paint them dark blue with the round brush. Leave the white snowy cap on top of the mountain white for all of the steps.

13. Medium Blue Mountain Blocks

a. Pick four or more blocks on the mountain and paint them medium blue with the round brush.

14. Turquoise Mountain Blocks

a. Pick four or more blocks on the mountain and paint them turquoise with the round brush.

15. Purple Mountain Blocks

a. Pick five or more blocks on the mountain and paint them purple with the round brush.

16. Light Blue Mountain Blocks

- a. Pick the last three or more empty mountain blocks and paint them light blue with the round brush. The white snowy cap on top of the mountain should be left white.
- b. Allow the entire painting to dry before moving on.

17. Outline All of the Blocks

- a. With the liner brush and black paint, outline all of the blocks with a thin line. Go from top to bottom and left to right to avoid smudging the paint.
- b. Allow the entire painting to dry before moving on.

18. Sign Your Name

- a. Sign your name in one of the mountain blocks with the black marker.
- b. Don't sign your name too close to the black border or it will get cut off!
