Description:

Create a stunning stained-glass-inspired Arctic scene filled with vibrant pinks, purples, blues, and glowing golden sunlight. This beautiful artwork is fun to create and makes a bold, colourful piece that is suitable for all ages and skill levels.

- Black permanent marker
- Pencil

F-066 Pastel Ocean Sunset Art Project Instructions:

1. Prepare Your Paper and Supplies

- a. Place your Art Cards by Kids Art Sheet on the table vertically. Make sure the vertical arrows on the left side are pointing upwards.
- b. Gather the necessary supplies for your artwork as described.

2. Write your name

- a. At the top, write your name, teacher's name, age, and grade in big, bold letters using a marker or pen—no pencil!

3. Draw the Outlines

- a. With the pencil, draw the outline of the horizon and the sun surrounded by icebergs. In the ocean and sky, add large, curved blocks for different colours that look like stained glass.
- b. Please see the corresponding video for a visual demonstration of the outline instructions.

4. Colour in the Sky

- a. With several different shades of pink and purple pastels, colour in the sky blocks, starting with the darker colours at the top and the lighter colours at the bottom.
- b. Colour in one or two blocks of the same colour in random spots. Try not to have the same colour blocks next to each other.

5. Colour in the Sun

- a. With three different shades of yellow pastel, colour in the sun.
- b. Start by making a small semi-circle in the center of the sun with the darkest shade of yellow.
- c. Then, make a second layer of colour around the first semi-circle with the medium shade, leaving room for one more colour.
- d. Lastly, take the lightest shade of yellow and fill in the remaining white space in the sun around the outer edge.

6. Colour in the Icebergs

- a. With the darkest blue pastel you have, colour in the icebergs until they meet the horizon line.

7. Colour in the Ocean

- a. With several different shades of blue pastel, colour in the ocean blocks, starting with the lightest colours at the top and the darker colours at the bottom.
- b. Colour in one or two blocks of the same colour in random spots. Try not to have the same colour blocks next to each other.

8. Outline Everything

- a. With a black pastel, outline all of the original pencil lines. Go over the lines a second time if they are not dark enough after the first pass.
- b. Clean off the tip of the black pastel if the other colours transfer onto it. This will help you get the best black colour coverage.

9. Sign Your Name

- a. Sign your name or your first initial inside one of the icebergs with the black pastel.
- b. Don't sign your name too close to the black border, or it will get cut off!
